Student Mobility & Inward/Outward Migration Comments

FALL 2014

- The 2013-2014 school year, for the fourth year in a row, had the highest level of student mobility. Four years ago we had 721 students who moved in and out. Three years ago the mobility total was 960 students. September 2012 to September 2013's mobility total was 1,078. This past year we recorded 1,244 who move in or out of our District, which is equivalent to 36% of our fall enrollment.
- Last year's net gain in the mobility of student was 126 students. This amount follows a six year average of 81 per year.
- Not including new kindergarten students, we had 383 students enroll from the end of May to September 12th.
- During the past six years, we have had a net gain of 483 students through inward and outward migration. During this same time period our enrollment increased by 929.
- Utah leads the list of states for net inward migration at +68 in the past six years, followed by Colorado (+65), Minnesota (+60), and Washington (+53).
- More new students enrolled from Texas that any other state this past year. Minnesota, California, Colorado, and Montana were next. Washington was the highest inward migration state in 2013.
- The trend of students moving into the District in the past three years changed from 50% coming within the state to only 26% from within the state and 70% being from out of state.
- In the past year we enrolled students from 41 states and 7 different countries.
