Instructional Coaching Matters: A Plan to Support Teachers to be Their Personal and Professional Best.

 This was a presentation from an Illinois school superintendent regarding instructional coaches. This district is approximately twice as large as Dickinson Public Schools. There instructional coach model is much broader and more comprehensive than our district. He discussed how they implement the process and how faculty members received the coaching model. A key point he emphasized is that the assessment of students must drive the instruction.
