Welding Academy

The RACTC in a joint effort with the MRACTC will be hosting the 2016 Welding Academy on June 13-17 at the Bismarck Technical Center. The Welding Academy is open to students ages 16-19, and is limited to 25 participants. During the week the students will focus on industry skills and welding test procedures. Welding position certification will be provided to students that meet the standards. The cost to participants is only \$50 and includes lodging at a BSC dormitory as well as breakfast and lunch each day.

Vernier "Investigating Environmental Science Through Inquiry" Grant

The RACTC was able to obtain a \$25000 grant from the HESS Corporation to purchase an Environmental Science unit through the Vernier Company. This hands on unit can be in science or ag science classes. Each unit comes with testing equipment that attaches to the LabQuest2 data collection units. Some of the units that are included are:

The RACTC will be holding a two day workshop in Dickinson on July 12 & 13 for interested RACTC instructors. Teachers that complete the workshop will be able to use the unit during the 2016-17 school year.

Health Sciences Classes

The RACTC will have two Health Sciences teachers on staff for the 2016-17 school year.

Mrs. Bobbie Johnson will continue to teach Health Careers I, Health Careers II, and Medical Terminology at Dickinson High School.

Mrs. Bobbi Schneider will off classes through the ITV and Tegrity systems to other RACTC school. Mrs. Schneider will be teaching out of Hebron High School. She will teach classes in Health Careers I and Medical Terminology for 2016-17 and will expand the curriculum to include addition classes during the

2017-18 school year. Those classes will be determined on the needs of the schools but may include, Sports Medicine, Nursing Assistant and EMT.
