Dickinson High School educates an average of 890 students from grades 9 through 12 each year and employs 3 certified administrators, 59 certified teachers, 3 counselors and 36 classified members. DHS utilizes a four-period-per-day block schedule, allowing students to earn up to 8 credits per year. DHS is State A Accredited with Commendation by the North Central Association (NCA).

DHS offers approximately 188 different courses in a variety of academic and vocational areas, as well as, 6 Advanced Placement courses and college dual credit courses. Students can select courses to prepare them for continuing education at the technical or academic level. DHS has a history of preparing students who become National Merit Scholars.

In order to graduate from Dickinson High School, the following units of credits must be met. Students must also regularly be enrolled at Dickinson High School during the eighth semester to be eligible for graduation. A unit of credit is earned through class attendance one period per day, five days per week for one semester and successful completion requirements of that class. Students will be required to earn 26 credits for graduation.
