- SENIORS: The end of your senior year is quickly approaching, and it is unlike any other most of you have ever experienced! However, there are still some things that MUST be done! Make sure you are visiting with your counselor to make sure you are on track for graduation, to discuss your plans for after graduation, and to apply for the ND State Scholarship if you qualify.
- If you are a male student who has turned 18, you are required by law to register with the Selective Service at sss.gov within 30 days of your birthday. This must also be done to receive any Federal Financial Aid for higher education.
- JUNIORS: ND UNIVERSITY SYSTEM SCHOLARSHIP- The ND legislature has established the ND Scholars program to recognize student for outstanding achievement as measured by their ACT score. Juniors who qualify will receive a letter in the fall of their senior year. Students who attend a ND college or university will be awarded a full four-year-in-state tuition scholarship. The June ACT date is the last one that can be used to qualify.
- SPORTS IN COLLEGE: Juniors and Seniors-check with your counselor about the NCAA application, which must be completed if you plan to play sports in a Division I or Division II school. Allow plenty of time—it may take up to 45 days. The website is

www.ncaaclearinghouse.net. You must also make sure to have a final transcript sent.
