Free Application for Federal Student Aid

For the first time in years, the entire FAFSA

application/process has been revamped. Because of this, the application won't be available for completion until at least mid-December. As we get more information, I will send emails to seniors and post in the announcements. For now, you can go in and create accounts, but you can't get past that—it may be a good idea to do this ahead of time, as they anticipate large amounts of activity once the application is finally available for completion!

### North Dakota State Scholarship

The \$6,000.00 scholarship is available at approved colleges and universities in the state of North Dakota. Students may use this scholarship a total of eight semesters over the course of six years. Students receive \$1,500.00 per year (\$750.00 per semester).

To qualify for this scholarship, an ACT score of 24 is required, or three WorkKeys scores of "5" or higher. The three WorkKeys tests are <u>Applied Math, Graphic</u>

# *Literacy*, and *Workplace Documents*. These tests will be offered at DHS in the spring semester. The cost is \$13.00 per test, for a total of \$39.00. If retakes are done, they will also be \$13.00.

**\*\*\*NCAA Eligibility Center\*\*\***--This online application checks academic eligibility for students who want to play sports at a Division I or Division II college/university. Once complete, be sure to have your official transcript sent from the front office; have them send another one at the end of the school year as well.

**\*\*\*College/University Visits\*\*\***--(Juniors and seniors) Take the time and schedule a college visit! Many colleges/universities have open houses and tours for prospective students; check with the college's website or a college representative for special activities/events. Stop in and see your high school counselor if you need help making contact.

**\*\*\*Choice Ready**\*\*\* -- North Dakota stakeholders have adopted the framework of Choice Ready as an indicator to measure school growth in high schools. This concept focuses on the culmination of academic growth and gains, in combination with specific indicators of school success for post-secondary, workforce, and military readiness. Choice Ready framework is inclusive of all students, and helps students identify career clusters and related skills which will prepare and enhance success in any or multiple areas beyond high school. Students will be hearing more and more about this as we work with this shift in information. Please see the chart below, which helps to identify how students can meet criteria to be considered choice ready.



#### NORTH DAKOTA CHOICE READY

The North Dakota CHOICE READY framework is a tool to assist educators to ensure all students successfully depart high school possessing the ESSENTIAL SKILLS necessary to be ready for life. The journey begins by ensuring students leave having the ESSENTIAL SKILLS to be successful for whichever path they choose. Students shall then strive to be POST-SECONDARY READY, WORKFORCE READY, and/or MILITARY READY.



#### **ESSENTIAL SKILLS**

Eam a North Dakota high school diploma Complete a 9-week Career Education Course/Individual Counseling (15.1-21-18), Financial Literacy (15.1-21-21), and pass ND Civics Test (15.1-21-27), Computer Science/Cybersecurity Requirement (15.1-21-02.2), and four or more additional indicators:

- 25 hours of Community Service
- Two or More Years in Organized Extra-Curricular Activities
- 95% Attendance (not counting school-related absences) Successfully Complete a Capstone Project
- Career Exploration Experience

- Two or More Years in Organized Co-Curricular Activities
- Demonstrate Competency in 21st Century Skills
