NWEA Testing:

NWEA is a research-based, not-for-profit organization that supports students and educators worldwide by creating assessment solutions that precisely measure growth and proficiency— and provide insights to help tailor instruction. Put simply, NWEA tests provide information for students and teachers alike, indicating where they are academically and how much they grow between each testing period. This allows teachers to modify curriculum to meet student needs, as well as allowing students to set goals! Freshmen will be tested three times throughout the year, in September, January, and May.

ASVAB Testing:

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery is the most widely used multiple-aptitude test battery in the world. The <u>ASVAB</u> measures your strengths, weaknesses and potential for future success in four domains: verbal, math, science and technical, and spatial. It includes tests in 10 areas. The ASVAB is an indicator for success in future endeavors, such as college, vocational school or a military career. Test results will be interpreted with students the beginning of November.

- The PSAT is for any Sophomore (3.50 GPA or higher) or Junior (3.0 GPA or higher) who has paid the \$18.00 test fee to Mrs. Main in the library by Friday, Sept. 9 (Juniors eligible for 2022-2023 free reduced priced-meals may qualify for a fee waiver).

College/University Visits


